Is Competition Law suitable for Labour Markets?

In this month's article, Marcin Alberski and his colleagues from the Warsaw office delve into the complexities of applying competition law to labour markets. They provide insights into defining labour markets and discuss the implications of treating non-business entities as undertakings.

Globally, there is increased scrutiny on labour markets, with notable developments in the US and EU. In 2016, the US DOJ and FTC targeted wage-fixing and no-poach agreements, deeming them per se illegal. In the EU, we observed antitrust actions against sports leagues, which led to broader enforcement across various sectors, from food delivery services to IT services. The European Commission is investigating no-poach agreements, highlighting their negative impact on employees and competition. As authorities

focus on labour markets, we anticipate precedent-setting decisions that could reshape the application of competition law in this area. Discover more about these developments and their potential impact by reading the full article.


